THE RULES

1. How to Enter the Soup Fest: Fill out the Entry and Indemnity forms and mail by August 31 with your donation (a donation of \$20 is requested). Then all you have to do is show up at 12 noon with your team (we suggest at least 2 people in your team) and your soup pot full of your secret soup recipe and/or samples of your delicious bread.

2. Both restaurants and community organizations will be encouraged to participate in the fun but will be two separate contests and judged separately.

Soup Entrants should bring a minimum of 4 gallons of soup. Due to the popularity of the event last year, some entrants ran out of soup.

Bread Entrants should bring enough bread to give samples out to 200 people.

3. A prize will be awarded for each contest for Best Presentation. All entrants will be encouraged to develop and maintain a theme by decorating their table area and/or wearing team attire to generate enthusiasm among the crowd and participants. You can customize your space with decorations, condiments and chips for tasting along with your soup.

4. Soup may be prepared with any kind of meat, chicken, fish, or legumes; vegetables; grains and starches; and various spices. Be creative. Just keep it healthy so that your entry is in sync with our main objective of the day – encouraging all to enjoy healthy and tasty food.

5. Monadnock Rotary will provide 6' tables, 2 chairs, tasting cups (2 oz.), spoons for the tasting and voting cards to the public upon entry to the festival.

6. Contestants need to be on the premises by 12 noon to set up. Soup must be prepared off site, delivered and served hot. Electrical outlets will be provided for you to keep your soup heated. Contestants must supply heating devices.

7. Sampling begins at 12.30pm . The public will judge the soup, the bread and your table. Prizes will be awarded for Best Presentation, Best Soup, and Best Bread. The contest will continue until 2.00 even if you run out of soup or bread.

8. The awards ceremony will take place at 2:30 pm with Best Soup Awards of Gold, Silver and Bronze Ladles awarded in the Restaurant/Caterer category, a Best Soup Gold Ladle Award in the Community category, A Best Bread Golden Bread Knife Award and a special Purple Ladle will be granted for the overall Best Presentation. Winners will receive beautiful plaques, a year's worth of bragging rights, and recognition in the local paper.
